ABSTRACT

Asinong Kantoro. Enforcement of State Administration Court's Rulings, supervised by Profesor Zudan Arif Fakurullah, SH. MH. as Promoter and Dr. Laode Ludita, SH. MH. as Co-promoter.

Background. Enforcement of State Administration Court's Rulings frequently were not complied with by the relevant Officials, but in such condition the court may not do something, since there is no any clear regulation to enforce the defendants to enforce the State Administration Court's ruling, so the rulings have not rendered legal certainty and benefit.

Problem. Problems of this dissertation are (1) Why the State Administration Court's rulings were not frequently complied with by relevant officials (2) Are the coercive efforts in the enforcement of the State Administration Court relevant to be applied in Indonesia (3) How to optimize the enforcement of the State Administration Court's rulings.

Results of Study. Results of the study of normative law and sociological law conclude (1) the Enforcement of State Administration Court's ruling frequently were not complied with by the relevant officials since there is no any clear regulation that may force the officials to enforce them (2) Coercive effort in enforcement of the State Administration Court's rulings is still relevant to be applied in Indonesia (3) Optimizing the enforcement of State Administration Court's rulings by (a) Improving the awareness at law and knowledge of officials of state administration with the community (b) Empowering the provisions of Law of State Administration Court No. 51 of 2009 and Law No. 30 of 2014 concerning Government Administration and recommended in order that the Government promptly issue its Implementation Regulation regarding coercive money and/administrative sanctions. It requires the handing over of sanctions of administrative law, sanctions of civil law and sanction of criminal law to the relevant officials who do not enforce the State Administration Court's rulings due to maladministration.
